### SUMMER 2011 Rules and Regulations

Welcome to Giants Neck Beach! We hope you have a wonderful, safe summer.

All Giants Neck Beach Association members are responsible for seeing that their families, guests and tenants act in compliance with the beach's bylaws and ordinances, which are available to all members, and with the laws and regulations of the Town of East Lyme. Here are some items of particular interest:

- 1 The maximum speed limit is 20 miles per hour on all roads. All vehicles must come to a complete stop at all stop signs.
- 2 Please remember that you may not take alcoholic beverages, glass containers or pets onto the beaches or rights of way, and consumption of alcoholic beverages and smoking are prohibited in both areas. Please remove from the beaches and rights of way anything you take onto them and any other trash you find while leaving the areas.
- 3 Radios and other listening devices must be used only with headsets on the beaches.
- 4 We ask that you extend courtesy to your neighbors with regard to noise or music from your residence and vehicles (especially after 10:00 p.m.) and that, per GNBA Ordinances, there be no lawn mowing or construction work before 8:00 a.m. Also, construction work must be completed by 6:00 p.m.
- 5 Bathing, sleeping or loitering on the beaches is not allowed between 10:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. Beach use is **restricted** to GNBA members and families, their guests and tenants.
- 6 Fishing is not permitted, except for GNBA members and their families, guests and tenants in the ponds, from the docks, or from the beaches and rights of way.
- 7 No boats or any kind of watercraft are allowed on either of the ponds.
- 8 All boat moorings must be registered with the Giants Neck Harbor Management Committee annually. All boats left on shore must be marked with the name of the owner. Boats must be removed from the beaches by December 1<sup>st</sup> and may not be returned to the beach overnight until April 1<sup>st</sup>.

- 9 The beaches, rights of way and common areas of the beach are only for the use of GNBA members and their families, guests and tenants. Please contact the East Lyme Police Department if you observe others in these areas.
- 10 Fireworks that explode or go into the air are illegal. Please do not use them.
- 11 Parking is allowed only at the homes of GNBA members. If any property owner has guests parking cars on their property, please be sure cars are completely on the property and not partially in the street. There is no on street parking allowed. Police will be notified and cars may be towed. If you wish to make special arrangements for one-time parking on Association property, please contact a BOG member.
- 12 Trash collection is on Wednesday mornings and requires use of town-issued trash cans. As of May 26, 2010 the Town started single stream recycling and items no longer need to be separated; they all go into the same can. They have provided a list of acceptable items. Recycled items are picked up every other week. Schedules of pickups have been mailed to your homes. The town will pick up 10 large items free per year. Call 860-739-8444 ahead of time for an appointment.
- 13 Trimmings and brush are not to be placed with trash. They are to be disposed of in a compost pile or by removal to the East Lyme recycling center. Dumping of clippings, refuse or garbage onto Association property is prohibited.
- 14 Both GNBA and the town of East Lyme have leash and “pooper scooper” laws. Please keep your dog on a leash when not confined within a yard and carry a “pooper scooper” or plastic bag and properly dispose of your dog’s waste.
